27-31 July

Virtual Fleet Week takes place online 27-31 July. With the Navy, Coast Guard, and Marine Corps, Fleet Week sponsors Navy League Seattle, Seafair, and the Port of Seattle are bringing a full slate of interesting and engaging virtual experiences to the public via social media, all united by the hashtag **#FleetWeekSeattle**. A similar approach was used very successfully in May for New York's annual Fleet Week.

With the assistance of our volunteers and sponsors, Navy League Seattle is contributing several events to this year's festivities:

- A virtual parade of ships, featuring images and information from 40 years of ships visiting the Seattle waterfront (Monday 27 July);
